Greetings of the day and thank you all for accepting our invitation & for gracing this occasion.

Times have changed, and while science and technology have significantly advanced, achieving peace and unity requires a strong focus on education, particularly within schools, where fostering empathy, understanding of diverse perspectives, and conflict resolution skills can be cultivated from a young age, laying the foundation for a more peaceful society.

Education is the best weapon for peace & with this vision in mind, we welcomed the academic session 2024-25 which was filled with joyous & memorable moments and it is with immense pride that I present the 12th Annual Report of the school for the year 2024-25 documenting its activities and achievements.

The academic year was marked with many events and success stories. This can be attributed to the dedication and team spirit of the members of the management, staff, parents and students.

Classes for students from Pre-Nursery to Std XII began on 5^{th} June 2024 and the first assembly of the year was marked with a pledge to keep our planet green as the school celebrated World Environment Day on the 5^{th} of June.

The school currently has a strength of 354 students and a total of 44 staff which includes 28 academic staff, 5 administrative and 11 multitasking staff.

ACADEMICS:

We are proud to acknowledge before this august audience that the third batch of MTCS students who appeared for the AISSE Std X CBSE exam came out with flying colours. We achieved 100% results with 72% of the students getting distinction marks. Aaron A Mathew secured 92% and became the topper of the school. Congratulations to all the winners. May God Almighty bless each one of them abundantly.

All through the academic year, our focus was on delivering competency based education and our teachers used innovative pedagogy approach to infuse experiential & joyful learning in our classrooms. Apart from preparing the children to qualify for purely academic demands, special efforts are being made continuously to enable them to face the challenges of the competitive

world. It's a matter of great importance to us that our students should carry forward the values they have inherited, excel in whatever they do & be role models in the society.

Across the 2024 calendar year, learning was experienced through a range of innovative teaching practices. Our teachers make a difference and our strength lies in the combined contribution of every staff member.

- To promote & strengthen competency-based education, the school participated in CBSE's SAFAL
 Structured Assessment For Analyzing Learning . SAFAL is a stepping stone to enable competency-based education in all CBSE schools. Students of Grades V & VIII were tested on core concepts learnt, application of knowledge & higher order thinking skills.
- Students from LKG to Std VIII who required special attention in academics were identified and necessary support & mentoring was provided.
- Homework assignments were carried out in the last period under the supervision of the teachers.
- Emphasis was laid on forming a neat and legible handwriting and in the neat maintenance of books.
- As part of the curriculum, Yoga classes were conducted on all Wednesdays for students from standard III to VIII.
- To encourage good reading habits, students were encouraged to participate in Book Review,
 Story Telling Competitions and other platforms offered by the CBSE like the Reading Challenge
 Contest & Budding Author Competitions. A two-day Book Fair was held in the school to create & develop a love for reading.
- Students actively participated in the English, Maths, Science, GK & Computer Science Olympiad
 exams conducted by the Science Olympiad Foundation (SOF) & in the Green Olympiad conducted
 by The Energy & Resources Institute (TERI). Desiya Hindi Scholarship & Malayalam Mampoov
 Scholarship exams were also conducted. These Olympiad exams boosted our students' analytical
 & problem-solving skills.

PREFECT'S INVESTITURE:

Our school office bearers were officially sworn in a very impressive ceremony on 21st June 2024. The principal administered the oath of office to the Head Boy, Sreehari Krishna and Head Girl, Meeghul Mary Anzil & to the other 28 office bearers. The chief guest Vice President, Rev. K E Geevarghese, Secretary to the Marthoma Metropolitan & former Vice- President of MTEA delivered the keynote address. I take this opportunity to thank all the student leaders who executed their responsibilities excellently and offered their assistance to the school during the school year.

CONNECTING HOME & SCHOOL:

Education is a three way dynamics, involving the students, their families & the school working in unison. We cherish our parents' co-operation and their constructive suggestions in our endeavour to impart quality education.

Our parents of kindergarten & primary school attended a session on 'Mindful Parenting' led by Ms Bini Alan of the Centre for Differently Abled Children, Paippad.

Open houses for all classes were held at regular intervals and feedback on students' academic and general performance in school was shared with parents.

STUDENT ENRICHMENT PROGRAM:

- Field Trips provide authentic, hands-on experiential learning opportunities where students
 can connect what they are learning in classroom in a real world context. The tiny tots of the

 foundation to its completion & Std IV students visited the rice fields in Upper Kuttanad.
- Students from Std IV had the golden opportunity to visit & interview the Managing Director of Kochi Metro & former DGP Shri Loknath Behra in his office in Kochi.
- Std X to XII students attended a seminar in MTRS on Aerospace led by Dr Tessy Thomas, Former Project Director, Agni IV missile.
- Std IX to XII students participated in the All Kerala Medical Exhibition conducted by Believers Church Medical College Hospital.
- This Onam, we joined hands to support those who were affected in the Wayanad landslide. Our
 parents generously contributed in the outreach program & the amount of Rs 80000 collected was
 handed over to The Council of CBSE Schools Kerala.

- A Liquid Embroidery Workshop by Fevicryl was conducted for the students of the Home Science & Craft Club.

 A motivation cum career guidance class by Mr Krishnaraj, soft skills trainer was given to students of Std IX to XII on digital well-being & stress-free study habits.

STAFF ENRICHMENT PROGRAM:

With the sole purpose of updating their knowledge & for a promising start to the academic year, all the teachers attended a two-day staff orientation program in the month of May.

The school arranged capacity building Programs on inclusivity & how to manage students with learning disability, on Holistic Progress Card as mandated by the NEP 2020, Application of AI Tools in Curriculum, ChatGPT & on how to teach with empathy.

Apart from this, our teachers are made a part of the training sessions & workshops in various academic subjects happening at other schools. Attendee teachers further share the knowledge with other fellow teachers widening the sphere of wisdom. As part of in-service training, all teachers have to attend 50 hours of Continuous Professional Development trainings in an academic year.

Three of our teachers were appointed as observers for the National Assessment Centre- PARAKH - Performance Assessment Review & Analysis of Knowledge for Holistic Development.

Our teacher Ms Leena Jacob received her Training of Trainers (ToT) Certificate from the CBSE & is now qualified to be appointed as a resource person for Capacity Building Programs conducted by the CBSE & Centre of Excellence, Tvm.

The Principal attended the 15th All Kerala CBSE Principals' Leadership & Conference Training in Kochi which focused on the theme "Transforming Schools in Line with the National Curriculum Framework" & also attended workshops conducted by the Central Travancore Sahodaya Complex.

COUNSELLING CLASSES:
